The Closing Show recognized each lodge's Founder's Award recipients and concluded with a special candle light Rededication ceremony. Next everyone went to the Section Feast where the lodge served Jambalaya and Sweet Tea. On Sunday morning everyone packed for home then went to the Worship service and Awards Show. Tsoiotsi Tsogalii received the highest award of the year, **Honor Lodge**, signifying the best overall program in the Section. The Brotherhood Weekend in May was a rousing success! Numerous projects were completed around camp including Building 18 Scoutmaster Platforms, Repairing 20 Rocking Chairs, Spreading mulch at the tower and Honor Wall, Cutting dead trees around camp, and general cleaning of the OA Lodge, campsite latrines, and trails. There were eight new members inducted and a record 56 members became Brotherhood.

On October 5-7 the lodge held an Ordeal Weekend at Cherokee Scout Reservation. Over 200 candidates were inducted into the lodge. Lots of important projects were completed at camp.

November 2-3 was the lodge's annual fundraiser – the Stew Sale. The lodge dipped 1,300 quarts of stew and made about \$1,200 in profit.



Over 400 lodge members attended the 2001 Fall Fellowship held at Camp Cherokee on November 16 - 18. Special guests included National Vice Chief Scott Hunter, Region Chief Jason Kemp, and Section Chief Nathan Finnin. The event included a Gong Show, Lodge Olympics, a Merit Badge Midway, and a spectacular Winter Banquet.



On Friday night Travis Ramsey, Chris Erickson, and Chris Phillips served as "Gong Ringers" for the Tsoiotsi Tsogalii Lodge's version of the Gong Show. Saturday morning was filled with Merit Badges as Brothers could work on Automotive Repair to Railroading, Chemistry to Truck Transportation.
