Registration

Your next step is to choose an Inductions Weekend and pre-register for the weekend by filling out a registration form and submitting the form with payment to the Council Office or register online through the lodge website. Register early, as space for the Inductions weekends is limited to the first 175 candidates. Registration forms are available at the Council Office, or you can register and pay online at: <http://lodge70.org>. A medical form is also required for each candidate that does not require a doctor's visit and signature. The cost for the Inductions Weekend is \$50, and includes: Meals, Ordeal Sash, Dues, OA Handbook, lodge pocket patch, and cost of brotherhood sash for conversion.



What to Expect

The Ordeal is a vital part of the induction process of the Order of the Arrow. The Ordeal provides a time for a Scout to reflect upon his experiences within Scouting. These reflections will hopefully broaden his experiences, and reaffirm his love for Scouting. During the Ordeal experience, a candidate is required to:

- Maintain silence
- Receive small amounts of food
- Work on Camp improvement projects
- Sleep alone and apart from other campers

The entire experience is designed to teach significant values. Induction weekends are filled with many activities, all of which are safe and fully supervised in accordance with BSA Policies. There are hundreds of thousands of OA members, all of whom have participated in an Ordeal. The Ordeal experience is one that no scout will ever forget because of the honor that has been given by being inducted into the Order of the Arrow.

Arrival Information

Please plan to arrive to the Inductions Weekend Location no later than 7:00 p.m. on Friday evening. Proceed immediately to the registration table where you will be given instructions and a schedule for the weekend's activities. Please arrive on time, as tardiness will delay the progress of the weekend. A dinner is provided on Friday night after check-in from 6 to 7:15pm.

Departure Information

The induction weekend will conclude on Sunday at 9-9:30 am. All parents are invited to a brief meeting in the dining hall prior to departure.

ONSC Refund Policy

Please be advised refunds on Council, District, or OA Events and Activities will be made only if an adult calls 5 days before the event to the Council Office to cancel that registration. The only exception to the policy will be the case of illness, accident and/or death in the family and that cancellation must be called in the day before the event. Refunds cannot be transferred to future events or functions. The exception being High Adventure Activities. Refer to the High Adventure payment schedule.
